Our engagement via Facebook has steadily increased to over 1000 followers!




## A big bus weekend!

On the 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> May, after most Covid related border restrictions were lifted, BPASA planned two consecutive days of events in order to appeal to interstate visitors. And appeal it did; with 15 people making the journey to SA to join us.

On the Saturday was our Old Ways, New Bridges Tour which followed discontinued routes and toured new Adelaide Transport Infrastructure. 45 people attended, riding 1812 and 1897.

The Sunday was our inaugural Bus Rally held in collaboration with the Tram Museum at St. Kilda. All of our members displayed one or more of their buses and bus a tram rides entertained a large. Xx buses and xx people attended a fun day!



### **Events**

Our annual visit to the National Railway Museum saw us once again provide bus rides and a display for the Port for the Heritage Transport Expo on 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> October 2021.
